THE USS SALUEL B. ROBERTS

The plaque in our wardroom telow the picture of a handsome young man r sads:

U.S.S. ROBERTS (DE-413)
Samuel Booker Roberts, Jr.,
Coxswain, U.S.N.R.
Porn May 12, 1921
Died September 28, 1942
Navy Cross

"For extraordinary heroism as member of the crew of a Higgins Roat assisting in the rescue of a group of Karines surrounded by enemy Japanese forces on a b eachneed on Gurdalcanal, Solomon Islands on 27 September 1942. Although he knew that his boat was to be used for the purpose of drawing enemy fire army from other craft evacuating the trapped Larines, Roberts with utter disregard for his own personal safety, voluntee red as member of the crew. With his lightly named boat stationed in an exposed position, he galloutly remained at his post until, at the close of the operation he was wounded by enemy fire. By his great valor and fearless devotion to duty, he contributed directly to the success of his mission, saving the lives of many who otherwise might have perished."

This, however, does not tell the whole story. Samuel B. Roberts, Jr. was born in the City of Sen Francisco and at the age of 18 enlisted in the Naval Reserve at Portland Oregon. He was associated with the Third Division and early in 1941 went into active duty aboard the transport USS HAYMARD. This duty, however, was not active enough to suit him and he volunteered for instruction on a landing craft. As Coxswein of a Higgins Boat throughout the operations at Guadalcanal he saw plenty of the excitement he craved, just how much will never be known as his life was ended while gallently exposing himself to danger to save others.

His mother and father were in Boston during our post-shakedown evailability and went through the ship. These people are very proud of their sen, and very proud of the ship named for him, and they wish the best for all who man her. They will be watching with interest the deings of our ship - and we will try to make a record worthy of the man for whom she is named.

A member of the crew of the USS MORNET when Doclittle's beriers took off from the favour carrier's Light deck to bomb Tokyo and latter service on the USS COLUMNIA when that cruiser was engaging in many of the early Pacific battles has carred Cultan Wallane, CDM, 14 stars for his service bars.

Now a veteran of 18 years haval service, Wallace heils from Valliant, Okla., where he was born in 1905. He graduated from high school in Pallas, Texas where he played four years varsity football as a guard and tackle.

In 1926 he enlisted in the US Navy at Little Rock, Ark. and took his "boot training" at the San Diego base. His first assignment aboard the USS LISSISSIPPI lasted four years during which time he earned Sic. As a regular on the battlewagen's football team, Wallace helped his mates attain the title "Football Champions of the United States Fleet".

After two months as a civilian, Wallace recollisted for his second "hitch" and was returned to the USS MISSISSIPPI. Four months later he was rated Coxswain. Upon the docummissioning of the MISSISSIPPI, Wallace was transferred to the USS MEVADA where he served out his second enlistment. The future CBN spent a total of seven years on the MEVADA during which time he played on the Navy football team.

In 1937 Wallace was given China
duty on board the USS Pope with advancement to BMZc. He spent 35 months
in the North and South China scas and
insists that the best liberty port in
the world is Shanghai, "The Crossroads to Hell".

Shipmates ...

In 1941 he again reenlisted and was sent to Morfolk to help cormission the first USS HORNET. Wallace was promoted to EAG before the E25's took off from the MORNET'S deck for their Tokyo run. Other buttles included the battles of the Coral Sea, Midway, Reynold's Islands, before the battle of San Cruz in which the MORNET was sunk.

Wallace come back to the states and helped commission the USS COLLEBIA. He was rated Chief Boatswain Mate 1 Feb. 1943. On this ship he saw action at Java, Guadalcanal, Munda, Bouganville and was in the battle of the fleets at Empress Augusta Bay. This running battle lasted three hours and 51 minutes. His ship was credited with sinking one heavy cruiser and two destroyers. They also were credited with knocking down 16 enemy planes.

Sent to Mari as an instructor during Jamery 1944, the chief egain requested sea duty and was assigned to the nucleus crew of the USS SAMUTA. B. RUFFRTS.

He wears five service ribbons with the stars indicating 14 major engagements.
