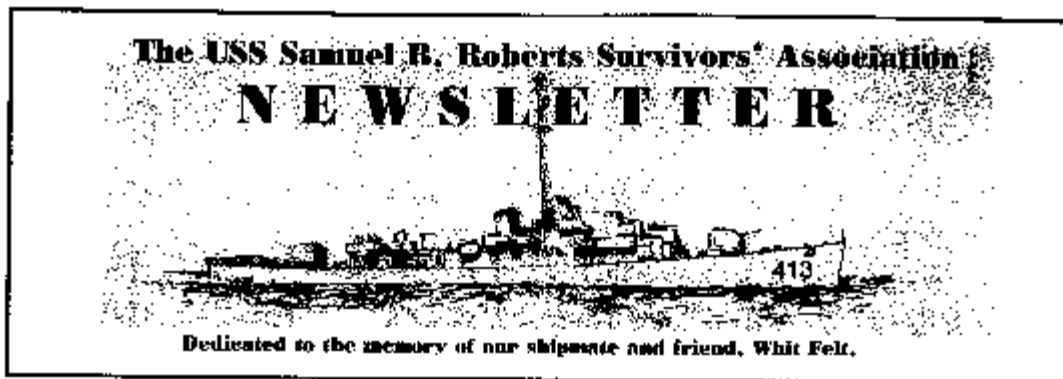

Death Claims Shipmate Whit Felt

On Wednesday, October 7, 1998 our shipmate, Whit Felt died peacefully following a short battle with cancer. He was with his family in his last moments.

Whit was not only one of the founders of our Association, but was instrumental in finding missing members of our crew, bringing them into the group and holding us all together through the NEWSLETTER. He most generously supported our activities and was always available to all of us to discuss whatever cares and concerns we might have in seeing that the SAMUEL B. ROBERTS SURVIVORS ASSOCIATION maintained a true course.

Whit was very active in the affairs of his home town, Salt Lake City. His interests included the Salt Lake Lions Club which he served as President and the Utah Museum of Natural History which he served as Board Member and as President.

He was deeply involved in the affairs of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints which he served in many capacities. A true sports lover, Whit followed the basketball and football teams of the University of Utah, his alma mater. He and Leah spent a good portion of their time cheering on the efforts of those Utes. I recall his telling me of the time that he accompanied the basketball team, on the team plane, to one of the tournaments. Whit was
