Rear Admiral Robert W. Copeland



Robert Wilcher Copeland was born in Tacoma, Washington on September 9, 1910. At the age of 18 he enlisted in the Naval Reserve and while at the University of Washington joined the Naval Reserve Officer Training Corps Unit. He graduated from the University of Washington with Bachelors Degrees in Business Administration and Law, and on May 18, 1935 was commissioned an Ensign in the Naval Reserve. In that same year he was admitted to the Washington State Bar and practiced Law until entering into active Naval Service in 1940.

During the early 1940's he advanced rapidly and successively commanded the USS PAWTUCKET (YT 7), USS BLACK DOUGLAS (PYC 45) AND USS WYMAN (DE38).

In 1944 a new Destroyer Escort, DE 413 was being built to respond to the desperate wartime needs. On April 28, 1944 the ship was commissioned USS SAMUEL B. ROBERTS (DE 413) and placed under the command of (then) LCDR ROBERT W. COPELAND.

SAMUEL B. ROBERTS was ordered to the Pacific Theater of Operations and fought in the Battle off Samar. It was that battle in which LCDR Copeland inspired his crew to such heights that, in spite of being a small destroyer escort, the ROBERTS helped turn back the formidable Japanese Battleship, Cruiser and Destroyer Force and contributed to the key victory in the Battle of Leyte Gulf. The ROBERTS was sunk in the battle, but not before she carried out her mission in heroic fashion and earned the reputation of being "the Destroyer Escort that fought like a Battleship". LCDR Copeland was among the 120 survivors who were rescued some 50 hours after the battle. For "extraordinary courage and magnificent spirit in the face of terrific odds" LCDR Copeland was awarded the Navy Cross.

Returning to the United States, he attended the Naval War College until he was assigned duty at Headquarters, Fifth Naval District, Norfolk, Virginia. He was released from active duty on January 25, 1946 but remained an active member of the Naval Reserve. He was subsequently admitted to practice law before the United States District Court, Western District of Washington, Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals, United States Supreme Court.

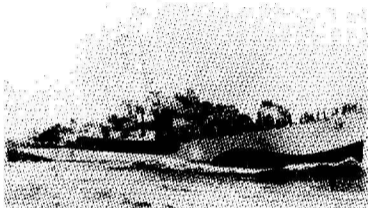
He died on August 25 1973 having attained the rank of Rear Admiral in the United States Naval Reserve.

On August 7, 1982 the USS Copeland (FFG-25) was commissioned at U.S. Naval Station Long Beach California, named in honor of Rear Admiral Robert Wilcher Copeland. His widow, Mrs. Robert W. Copeland served as the Ship's Sponsor.

A Brief History of USS Samuel B. Roberts (DE-413)

The SAMUEL B. ROBERTS (DE-413) was laid down on December 6, 1943 by Brown Shipbuilding Co., Houston Texas; launched on January 20, 1944, sponsored by Mrs. Samuel B. Roberts; and commissioned on April 28, 1944. LCDR Robert W. Copeland, USNR, in command. The ROBERTS had a displacement of 1,745 tons; length 306'; beam 36'7"; draft 13'4"; speed 24 knots; complement 222; armament, 2-5", 4-40mm, 10-20mm, 3-21" torpedo tubes, 2 depth charge racks, 8 depth charges, 1 hedge hog. She was of the John C. Butler class.

The ROBERTS was named in honor of Samuel Booker Roberts, Jr., a Coxswain who was posthumously awarded the Navy Cross for extraordinary heroism while serving on the crew of a landing craft that, despite intense enemy fire, rescued stranded Marines from Guadalcanal.



Following a shakedown off Bermuda from May 21 to June 19 and availability at Boston Navy Yard, SAMUEL B. ROBERTS departed from Norfolk on July 22, 1944 and transited the Panama Canal on July 27 to join the Pacific Fleet.

After arriving at Pearl Harbor on August 10 she conducted training exercises and escorted several convoys to Eniwetok. SAMUEL B. ROBERTS proceeded to Manus Island where she joined Task Unit 77.4.3, then steamed for the Leyte Gulf area and commenced operations with the Northern Air Support Group off Samar.

Shortly after dawn on October 25, 1944, SAMUEL B. ROBERTS was protecting American escort carriers off Samar, when a Japanese task force suddenly appeared on the horizon and opened fire. After joining in a daring torpedo attack on the Japanese cruisers and scoring a torpedo hit on one and at least 40 gunline hits on a second, SAMUEL B. ROBERTS was hit by a salvo of 14" shells which tore a hole 40 feet long and 10 feet wide in the port side of her number 2 engine room. The ship was abandoned and soon sank. The 120 survivors clung to 3 life rafts for 50 hours before being rescued. 90 of the crew were killed or lost in action. SAMUEL B. ROBERTS was included in the Presidential Unit Citation given to Task Unit 77.4.3 "for extraordinary heroism in action".

USS SAMUEL B. ROBERTS (DD 873) was named after DE 413. USS COPELAND (FFG-25) was named after the Commanding Officer Robert W. Copeland, USS CARR (FFG-52) was named after Gannets Mate 3C Paul Henry Carr and USS Samuel B. Roberts (FFG-58) was named after DE-413.
